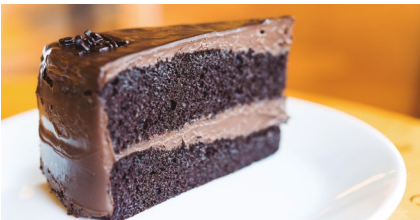

What do kids learn from skateboarding?

Skateboarding is a popular sport. Kids all over the world enjoy skateboarding. Skateboarding can even help kids do better in school.

Kids who skateboard learn to have patience. They don't give up. We see this when skateboarders learn new tricks. They practice a skateboard trick again and again. Finally, they learn the trick. Kids can do the same thing in school. They can have patience and never give up.

Jerry Carrera and Maria Ramblaz have a skate park in Los Angeles, California. They also have an after-school program called Skate-4-Education. Skate-4-Education is for kids ages 8 to 18. The program helps skateboarders do well in school. At Skate-4-Education, students get help with their homework. After they finish their homework, they can use the skate park. Skate-4-Education also gives students points for studying. Kids trade points for prizes, like T-shirts and skateboards.

Schools are also starting skateboard programs. Skate Pass is a program where students skateboard in gym class. And Oasis Skateboard Factory is a school that's only for skateboarders!
